# **Quidditch**

If you've ever read any of the Harry Potter books or seen the films based on them, then you are surely familiar with the game of Quidditch, also known as Quadball. The game involves a team of seven players with a broom between their



legs (unfortunately not a magical flying one!) trying to score more goals that the other side before the 'snitch' is caught. Points are scored when you pass one of the balls through the opponents' rings or manage to steal a small ball from the enemy runner.

This exciting new sport originated in Japan, and is essentially a huge snowball battle. Each team has 7 players and have to try to avoid being eliminated by an enemy snowball. Teams can prepare 90 snowballs before the game starts and then the battle

commences. If a player is hit by an enemy snowball they are out of the game. The last team to be eliminated wins, as simple as that.



An English parents' workshop was held on 18 October 2023. In the first part, different types of English assignments and formative assessments were introduced to parents.



#### Chinese Educational Visit - Yuen Yuen Care Attention Home for the Aged



# Chinese Educational Visit - Lung Yeuk Tau Heritage Trail



To provide an opportunity for students to learn more about the traditional life in the area of Fanling, a guided tour to Lung Yeuk Tau Heritage Trail was arranged on  $18^{th}$ ,  $19^{th}$  December, 2023 and  $4^{th}$ ,  $5^{th}$  January, 2024.

All P.6 students explored the traditional architecture, cultural heritage and ancestral custom of Hong Kong's rural communities. Along the trail, students found several notable attractions, such as the Tang Chung Ling Ancestral Hall which is the main ancestral hall of the Tang clan. Also, they visited Sheung Cheung Wai, a walled village that dates back to the 16<sup>th</sup> century. Students enjoyed the trip tremendously and were attentive while the tour guide was introducing the trail.





# **Kowloon Walled City Park**

The park occupies one of the most historic sites in the territory and consists of an outdoor display area and six exhibition rooms. ### Chinese Traditional Festival Art Decoration Design




# Games Day Flyer and Sports Day Booklet Cover Design Competition and Cheering Products Making


# Physical Education

# Tell-a-tale Children Storytelling Competition 2023-2024




On 22 <sup>nd</sup> April,2024, a training workshop was arranged to enhance the participants' storytelling skills.

# Robofest Hong Kong App Junior

Our students created games on Scratch with the aim of promoting environmentally friendly and hygienic concepts. Let's take a look at their games together!

## The Creenium created by 5A Aadhil

This game teaches people to protect trees. In Level 1, the player has to avoid trash and collect water in order to score points. As the player accumulates points, the character gradually changes its appearance from a seed to a tree. In Level 2, the player must extinguish fires in the forest within a limited time. Addhil's exceptional skills and dedication made him the champion of the competition.



## Save the Waves created by OA Talmiid

Tahmid created this game with the hope of teaching students about water pollution. He was awarded 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the competition. The game starts by catching rubbish with a fishing net while avoiding catching fish before time runs out. In the subsequent levels, more fish and corals appear, increasing the level of difficulty. If you win the game, you will finally witness a page with a dancing fish animation!







### Rubbish Frenzy created by 6A Everest

Everest developed a game with the objective of teaching people the proper way to recycle waste. To score points, players must continuously pick up rubbish from the floor. The next level of the game involves recycling the collected waste. To win, players must wash and dry each item before placing it in the appropriate recycling bin. This engaging game earned Everest 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the competition.

# Robofest Hong Kong RoboParade Junior



Students enjoyed the competition at the Education University of Hong Kong.

During the RoboParade event held on February 24th, 2024, a team consisting of Aleena from 5A, Faith from 5C, Ingsa from 6A, and Favour and Amnah from 6B collaborated to showcase their parade car, highlighting smart farming. The car was predominantly crafted using soft clay, combined with craft paper and LEGO pieces, to illustrate the role of modern technologies like Artificial Intelligence in enhancing farming practices. Notably, the car featured various interactive elements, including a light sensor integrated into the windmill, which utilized solar energy to generate electricity. 
# "Love, Innovate for Happy Ageing" Challenge Competition (LEGO Group and Micro: bit Group)





#### What is Mediation?

A statutory definition? See section 4(1) of the Mediation Ordinance (Cap 620, Laws of Hong Kong) –

(a) For the purposes of this Ordinance, mediation is a structured process comprising one or more sessions in which one or more impartial individuals, without adjudicating a dispute or any aspect of it, assist the parties to the dispute to do any or all of the following—

- (a) identify the issues in dispute;
- (b) explore and generate options;(c) communicate with one another;
- (d) reach an agreement regarding the resolution of the whole, or part, of the dispute.



The barrister-at-law explained to the SMC members and teachers the advantages of mediation for resolving conflicts and how to apply mediation skills in different context.


