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Quidditch

If you've ever read any of the Harry Potter books or seen the films based on them, then you are surely familiar with the game of Quidditch, also known as Quadball. The game involves a team of seven players with a broom between their legs (unfortunately not a magical flying one!) trying to score more goals than the other side before the 'snitch' is caught. Points are scored when you pass one of the balls through the opponents' rings or manage to steal a small ball from the enemy runner.



Toe Wrestling

You must have heard of arm wrestling, but you probably haven't heard of the less well-known sport of toe wrestling. The sport involves two competitors going head-to-head (or should that be foot-to-foot?) to try to pin their opponent's foot to the ground for at least 3 seconds. There are usually three rounds, with the winner having the best 2 out of 3.



Bossaball

Originating in Brazil but now played in many other countries, bossaball (not to be confused with baseball) is a team sport that combines volleyball, gymnastics and football with music. It is played on a huge inflatable court with trampolines which allow players to bounce high enough to spike or kick the ball over the net. Just like in volleyball, points are scored when the ball touches the floor of the opponent's side or they make an error. Music is a major part of a bossaball match and the person overseeing the game is called the 'samba referee' and is responsible for a DJ set as well as making calls about the game.



Yukigassen

This exciting new sport originated in Japan, and is essentially a huge snowball battle. Each team has 7 players and have to try to avoid being eliminated by an enemy snowball. Teams can prepare 90 snowballs before the game starts and then the battle commences. If a player is hit by an enemy snowball they are out of the game. The last team to be eliminated wins, as simple as that.

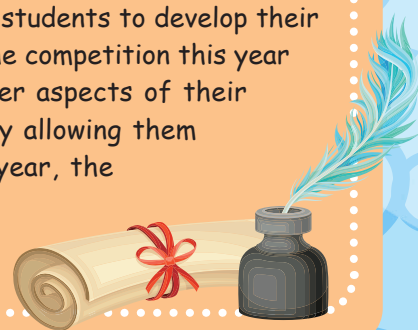

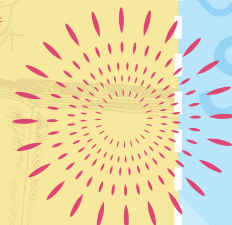

Chinese Educational Visit – Yuen Yuen Care Attention Home for the Aged

Students had also written greeting cards to each of the elderly and gave them towel teddy bears gifts. Chinese Educational Visit – Lung Yeuk Tau Heritage Trail

To provide an opportunity for students to learn more about the traditional life in the area of Fanling, a guided tour to Lung Yeuk Tau Heritage Trail was arranged on 18th, 19th December, 2023 and 4th, 5th January, 2024.

All P.6 students explored the traditional architecture, cultural heritage and ancestral custom of Hong Kong's rural communities. Along the trail, students found several notable attractions, such as the Tang Chung Ling Ancestral Hall which is the main ancestral hall of the Tang clan. Also, they visited Sheung Cheung Wai, a walled village that dates back to the 16th century. Students enjoyed the trip tremendously and were attentive while the tour guide was introducing the trail.



Kowloon Walled City Park

An educational visit to the Kowloon Walled City Park was arranged in December for all P.5 students.

The park occupies one of the most historic sites in the territory and consists of an outdoor display area and six exhibition rooms. Through the lively introduction of the tour guide, students appreciated the history of the former Walled City, the architectural theme of the Chinese Garden design as well as the unearthed relics. The visit has broadened the horizons of the students and enriched their knowledge of local culture and the history of Hong Kong.

Chinese Week

GS Educational Visits

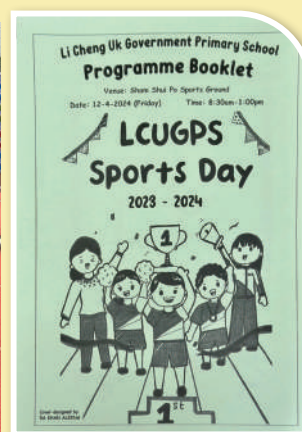
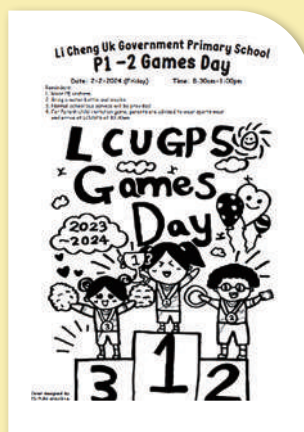
Chinese Traditional Festival Art Decoration Design

Best Reading Classes



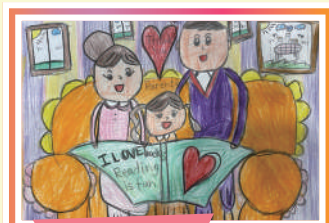
Classes with the highest score were awarded the "The Best Reading Class" of the month, scores were given based on the performance and atmosphere of the whole class during morning reading time.

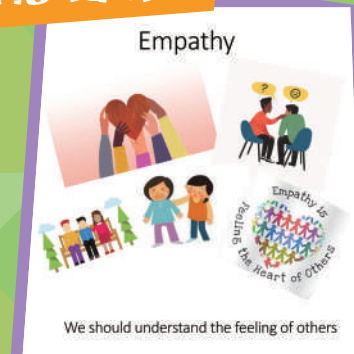
1st Term IT Project

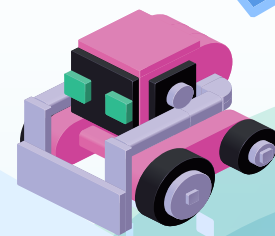


"Love Our Home, Treasure Our Country – Putonghua Ancient Poetry Appreciation Classes"

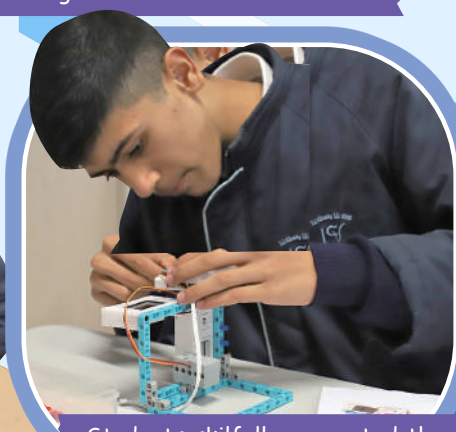

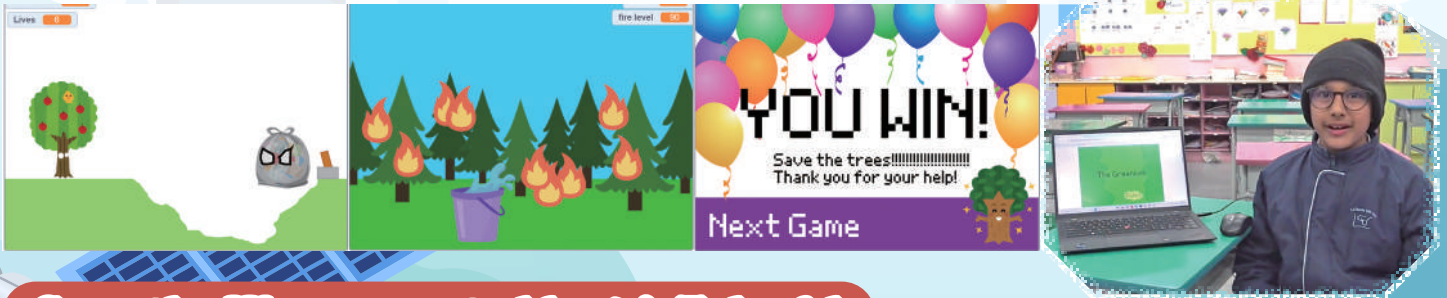

Our students created games on Scratch with the aim of promoting environmentally friendly and hygienic concepts. Let's take a look at their games together!

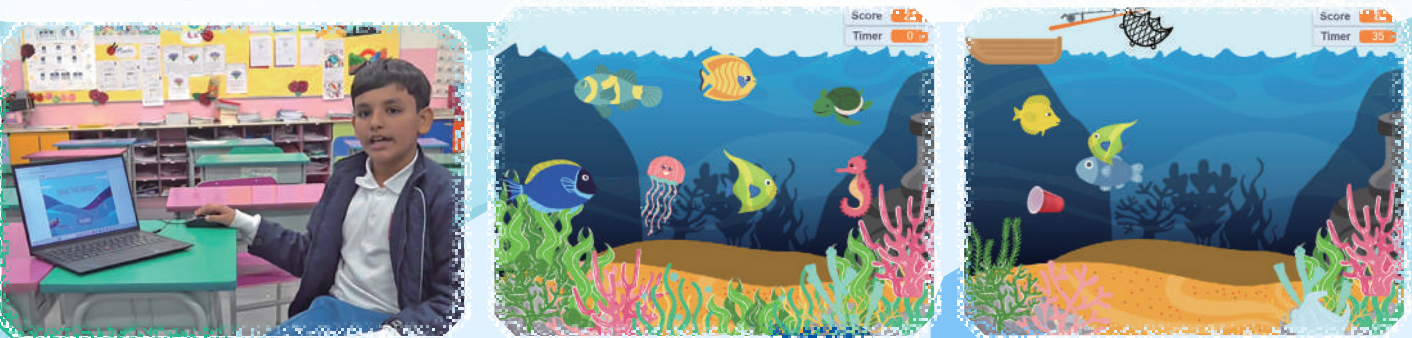
The Greenium created by 5A Aadhil

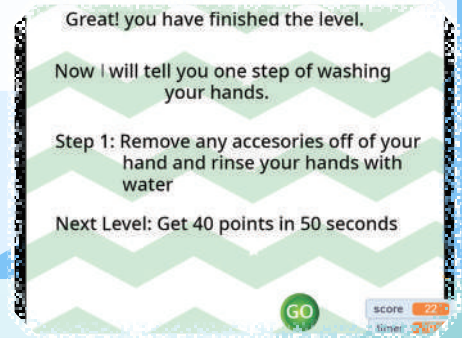
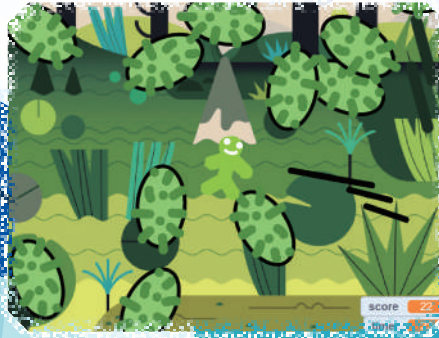
Rubbish Frenzy created by 6A Everest

The car was predominantly crafted using soft clay, combined with craft paper and LEGO pieces, to illustrate the role of modern technologies like Artificial Intelligence in enhancing farming practices. Notably, the car featured various interactive elements, including a light sensor integrated into the windmill, which utilized solar energy to generate electricity. The girls exhibited exceptional skill in crafting their soft clay models, and their strong teamwork resulted in them being awarded the Gold Award in the competition.

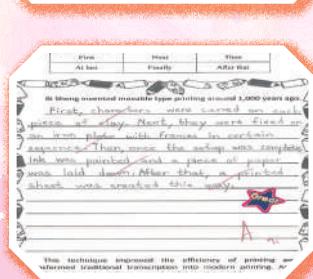
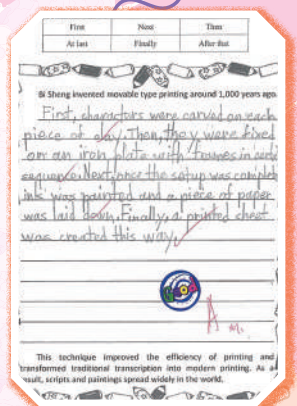
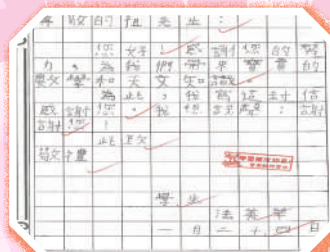

What is Mediation?

A statutory definition? See section 4(1) of the Mediation Ordinance (Cap 620, Laws of Hong Kong) –
(1) For the purposes of this Ordinance, mediation is a structured process comprising one or more sessions in which one or more impartial individuals, without adjudicating a dispute or any aspect of it, assist the parties to the dispute to do any or all of the following—

- (a) identify the issues in dispute;
- (b) explore and generate options;
- (c) communicate with one another;
- (d) reach an agreement regarding the resolution of the whole, or part, of the dispute.



The barrister-at-law explained to the SMC members and teachers the advantages of mediation for resolving conflicts and how to apply mediation skills in different context.

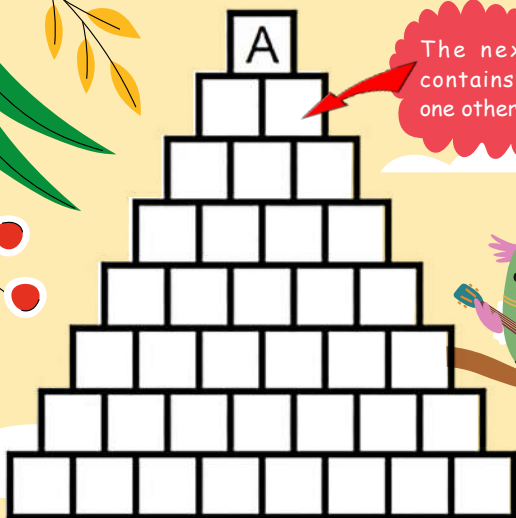

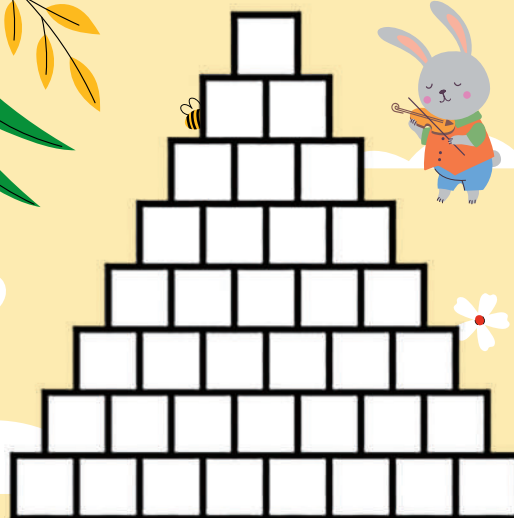

Unusual Sporting Events



Snail Racing
