

A Greener Planet

Did you know that over 550 billion plastic bottles are used each year? That's more than 1 million bottles per minute! Unfortunately less than 10% of plastic bottles are recycled. But it isn't just plastic bottles that can be recycled, there are lots of other things that we can recycle. Recycling Day is held every year on 15th November, but there's no reason why every day shouldn't be a recycling day.

What are the three Rs?
