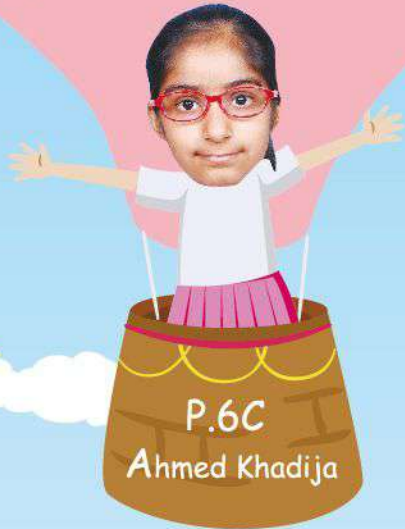
I am really glad that school has started again and now I can meet all my friends in school.

Flag-raising Ceremony

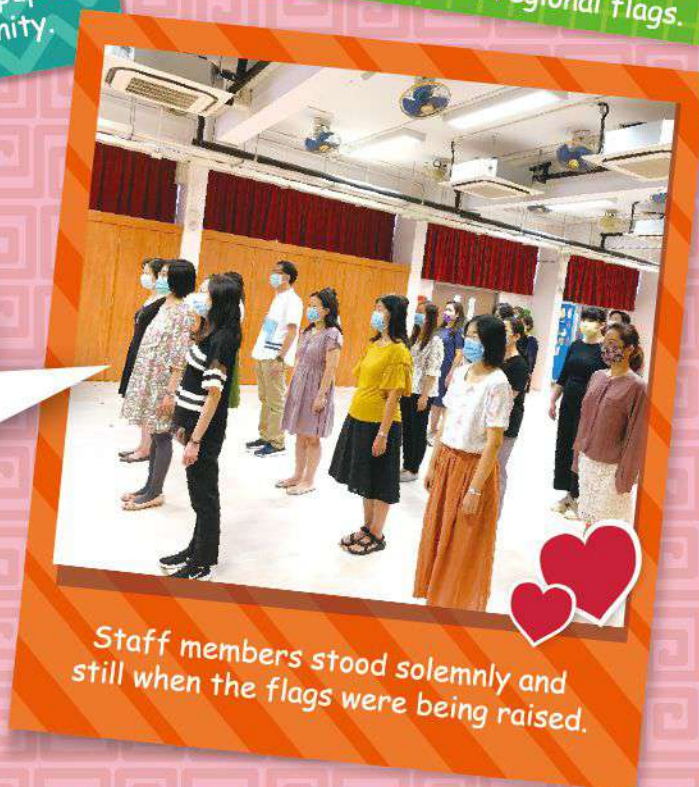

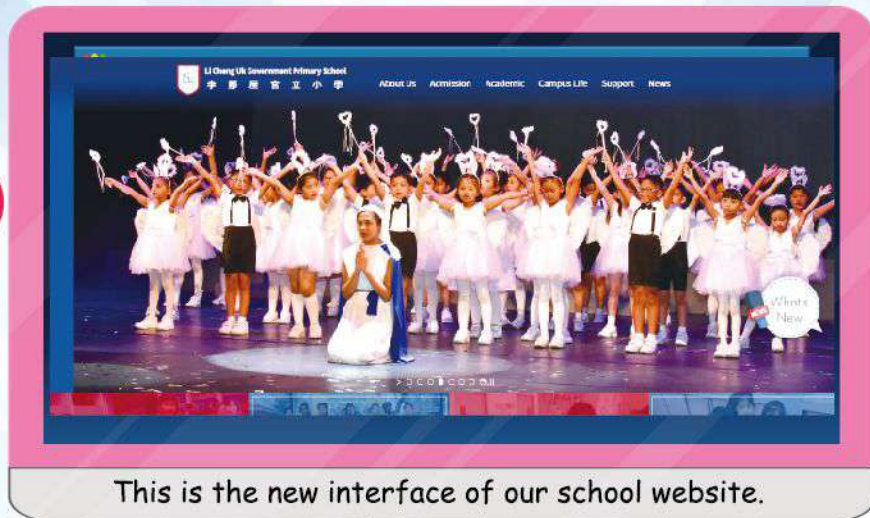

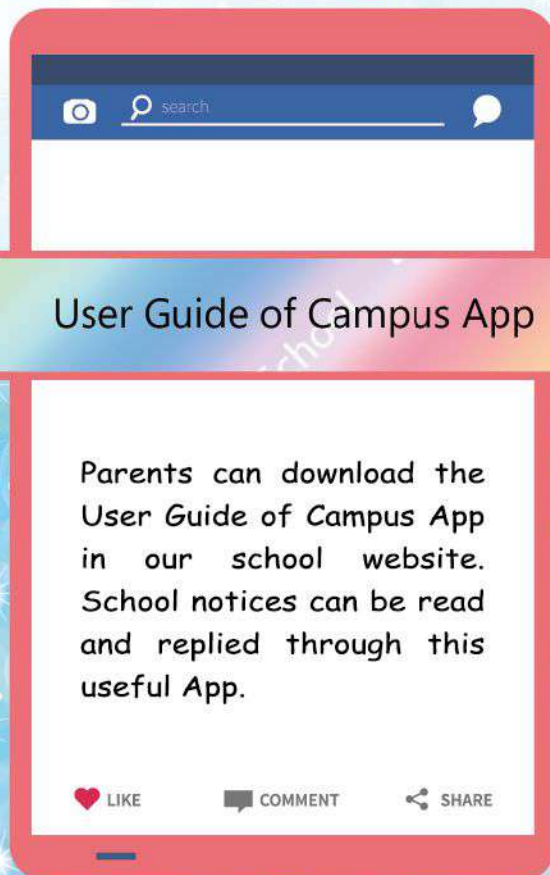

Our New School Website



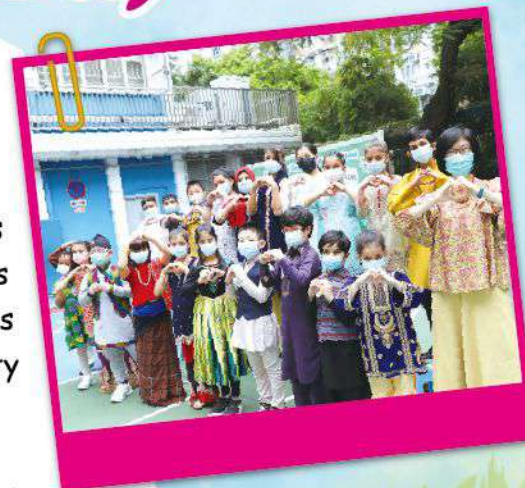

Work out what you think is a suitable and healthy amount of time for your kids

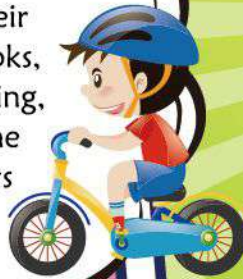

Encourage your kids to play with their friends, read books, play football, go hiking, etc. These are some healthy replacements for screen time.



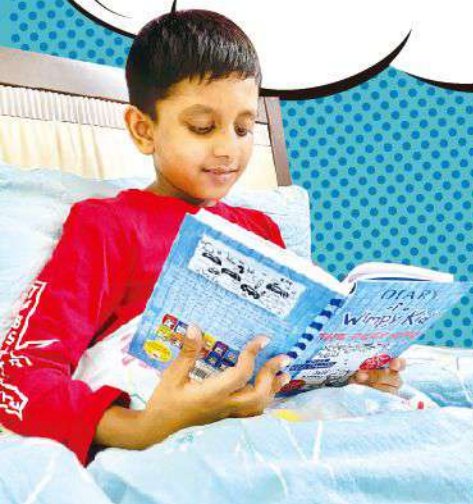
3. Mobile-free Meal Times

Remove all devices or smartphones from the dinner table and enjoy chatting with your family members.



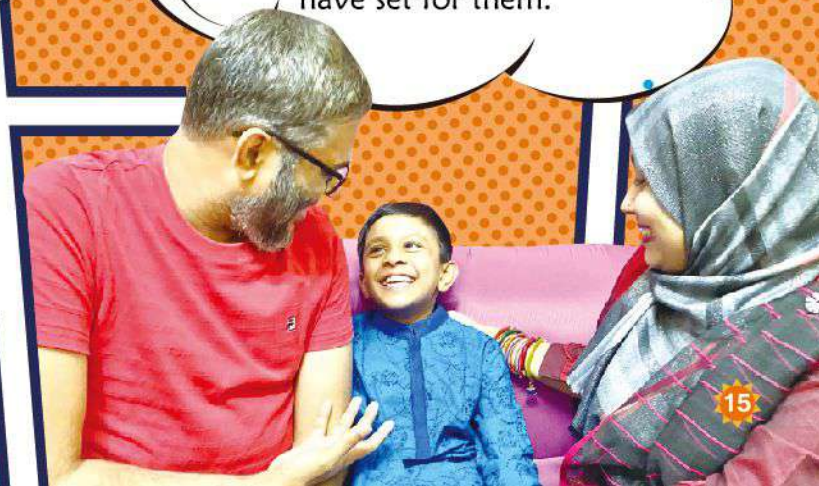
4. Remove Devices from Their Bedrooms

If parents are constantly on their computer devices and smartphones, their kids will see this as acceptable. Therefore, try to limit your own screen time and follow the same rules you have set for them.



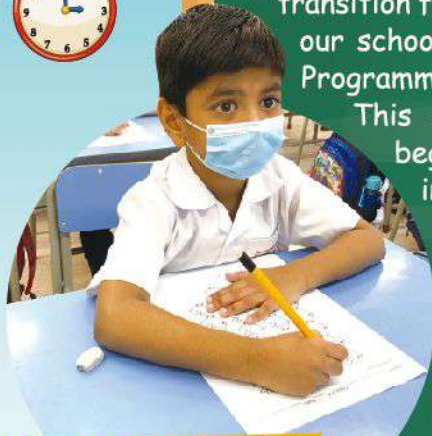
P.1 Transition Programme

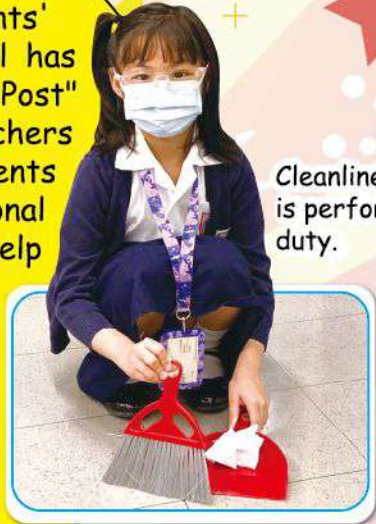

I hope to visit LCU soon. For every P.6 students this year, don't stress out too much and always take rests. Hope everyone has a happy school life and stay safe!



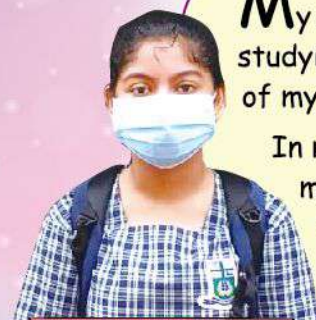
Xiao Yuk Hom

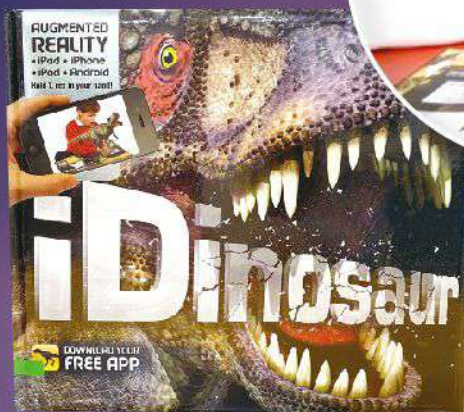

What about here in Hong Kong?

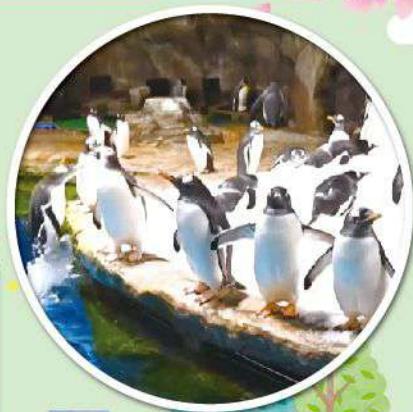
