Please note the following:

1. Arrangements for Resumption of Face-to-face Classes after the Easter Holidays

The Permanent Secretary for Education announced on 11 April that in light of the latest development of the COVID-19 epidemic situation, all schools in Hong Kong are allowed to resume face-to-face classes in an orderly and phased manner after the Easter Holidays as originally planned.

Therefore, **P.4-P.6 students will resume half-day face-to-face classes from 20.4.2022 (Wednesday) onwards. School bus service will be provided.**

2. Undergoing Regular Rapid-Antigen Test (RAT)

All students are required to complete a RAT* each day before returning to school. In general, RAT should be conducted in the morning and only those with a negative result are allowed to return to school for lessons. **Parents are required to record the students' RAT results and sign on the "Record of Regular Rapid-Antigen Test (RAT) of COVID-19" every day as attached at Annex 1.**

*(*For those recovered from COVID-19 and do not have symptoms, they are not required to be tested within three months from the date of the recovery.)*

Students should show their RAT Record Forms to the teacher-on-duty in the lobby when they enter the school premises. (Please print it out and fill it in on the first day of returning to school or you can write a note of the student's RAT result in the student homework record.) If any student has not conducted the RAT before returning to school, he / she is not allowed to enter the school. Parents will be informed to pick up the student concerned and go back home.

Students tested positive should not return to school and should inform the school of their positive results immediately and stay at home. They should also report to the Department of Health as soon as possible and within 24 hours via the "Declaration System for individuals tested positive for COVID-19 using Rapid Antigen Test" (<https://www.chp.gov.hk/ratp/>).

3. Submission of Copies of "Vaccination Records"

In order to collect the relevant information on the overall situation of students' vaccination in our school, please complete Annex 2 and submit the copies of your children's latest "Vaccination Records" to the class teachers when they go back to school.

4. Arrangement for "Vaccine Pass"

Under the "Vaccine Pass" arrangement which commenced in the school on 24.2.2022, parents entering our school must comply with the COVID-19 vaccination requirements as set out in Annex 3. For details, please refer to the website <https://www.coronavirus.gov.hk/eng/vaccine-pass.html>.

5. Summer Uniform

Students are allowed to wear either summer or winter uniform starting from 20.4.2022 (Wednesday). All students are required to put on summer uniform starting from 9.5.2022 (Monday). Please label the uniform

with your child's name.

6. Campus App

There is a new version of Campus App for iOS 15.4 or above. Therefore, parents must re-install the new version of Campus App on your iPhones for checking e-Attendance of your children and reading e-Notices.

The user guide for installation of Campus App has been uploaded on our school web.

7. Purchase of 2nd Term Exercise Books

- i. Ying Wah Printing and Stationery Factory is our exercise book supplier and will come to sell set exercise books directly to parents on **22.4.2022 (Friday)**.
- ii. All students have to buy a full set of exercise books and a Homework Book for the second term. The fees for the aforesaid items for different levels are listed as follows:

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- iii. The supplier has prepared Octopus devices to collect the fee of exercise books. Parents have to put **adequate amount of money** into your child's Personalized Octopus Card. If the Personalized Octopus Card is lost, students can use a Non-personalized one. Apart from this, Class Teachers have stuck a label bearing student's class name and class number on their Personalized / Non-personalized Octopus Cards. Please do not get rid of the label from those cards in this school year. It is because the label helps to identify whose card it is in case your child lost it. If you have more than one child studying in LCU, please put money separately into your children's own Personalized Octopus Cards.

8. Anti-epidemic Measures

Parents are reminded to pay close attention to the physical and mental health of your children and take anti-epidemic measures. Please avoid going out, especially to crowded places with poor ventilation. Students should maintain a balanced diet, exercise regularly, and take adequate rest in order to strengthen their immunity.

Record of Regular Rapid-Antigen Test (RAT) of COVID-19

All students are required to complete a Regular Rapid-Antigen Test (RAT) every school day before returning to school from 20 April 2022 onwards. The RAT should be conducted at home in the morning (<https://www.coronavirus.gov.hk/rat/eng/rat.html>) and those with a negative result (not being infected with coronavirus, with one single line shown on the test kit after the designated test time) are allowed to return to school for lessons as required by the EDB. Parents are required to record the test results in the table below. The school will check the record at the school lobby every morning when students return to school. If the test record of the day is missing, the student concerned cannot have lessons at school and the school will inform his /her parent to take the student home to reduce the possible risk of viral spread.

Students tested positive (being infected with coronavirus, with two lines shown on the test kit after the designated test time) should not return to school and stay at home. They should inform the school of their positive results by phone before 8:30am that day and also report to the Department of Health as soon as possible and within 24 hours via the “Declaration System for individuals tested positive for COVID-19 using Regular Rapid-Antigen Test” (<https://www.chp.gov.hk/ratp/>)

Note:

- For those who have only received the CoronaVac (Sinovac) or the Comirnaty (BioNTech) vaccines outside Hong Kong, their eligibility for Vaccine Pass should follow the requirements in the above Annex. In other cases, a person who received a "full course" COVID-19 vaccination outside Hong Kong will be deemed to have fulfilled the requirement for the 2nd dose, provided that the vaccine is on the list of recognised vaccines ("the List") on the Government's COVID-19 Thematic Website (https://www.coronavirus.gov.hk/pdf/list_of_recognised_covid19_vaccines.pdf), and the person has received the "dose(s) required" stipulated under the List. For any 2nd or 3rd dose received by the person in Hong Kong, eligibility for Vaccine Pass will be determined accordingly. A person who has received the Anhui Zhifei Longcom Biopharmaceutical, Bharat Biotech, the Gamaleya National Center of Epidemiology and Microbiology or Novavax (i.e. Nuvaxovid/Covovax) vaccines will be deemed to have completed the third dose under the Vaccine Pass requirements provided that the "dose(s) required" stipulated under the List has been satisfied.
- For a person who will turn 18, he/she will be given a 3-month window, counting from his/her 18th birthday, during which his/her eligibility will follow the category applicable to persons aged 12 to 17, and thereafter his/her eligibility will follow the category applicable to persons aged 18 or above.
- For a person who will turn 12, he/she will be given a 3-month window, counting from his/her 12th birthday, during which he/she will be exempted from Vaccine Pass requirements, and thereafter his/her eligibility will follow the category applicable to persons aged 12 to 17.
- Recovery is defined as 14 days after the date of the most recent documented positive test.
- The number of doses received before infection count only those doses received at least 14 days before the most recent documented positive test. In other words, a dose received within 14 days before the most recent documented positive test will not be counted as a dose received before infection.
